At a Court of Common Council, holden at the City Hall of the City of Saint John, on Saturday the 23d day of September, Anno Do-mini 1848:

Saturday the 23d day of September, Anno Domini 1848: Read and enacted the following Law : A Law in addition to the Law to prevent NUISAN-crss in the City of Saint John. **1.** Be it ordained by the Mayor, Aldermen and Common Lyoy of the City of Saint John, in Common Council convened, That no person shall ring any Bell for the purpose of crying or notifying Sales by Auction, or any other purpose within the City of Saint John, on any Side-Walk, or for a lon-ger space of time than one half-minute, at any one time, during which space of time the person so ringing such Bell shall stand and remain in one place or station; and that such person so ringing such Bell shall after the said period of such Ring-ing remove to a place or station where he shall be so removing from one place or station to the shall not return to and again ring his Bell at any one place or station, or within ten yards thereof, for the space of fifteen minute, stand and remag ; and that the said person so ringing such Bell shall not re-turn to and again ring his Bell at any one place or station, so that the said Bell shall not be rung ; any one place or station or while the space of fifteen minutes from and effer the time when he shall last have rung his Bell at the said place or station, so that the said Bell shall not be rung at any one place or station or while ten yards thereof, for the space of fifteen minutes from and effer the time when he shall last have rung his Bell at the said place or station, so that the said Bell shall not be rung at any one place or station or while ten yards of any such place or station rung that any person who

And be it orderined, That any person who hall so ring any Bell in the said City, contrary to he provisions of this Law, shall forfeit and pay the um of Five Shillings for each and every offence. III. And be it orderined, That if any person shall ing any Bell on any of the Streets, Wharkes, Squares or Alleys within this City, without having been first duly licened so to do by his Worship the Mayor, he shall be lable to a penalty of Twen-ty Shillings for each and every offence.
