Honors Won By Canadians

Canadian Headquarters in France, via London, Sept. 9.—(By Stewart Lyon, Special Correspondent of the Canadian Press)—The award of the military medal to twenty-four non-commissioned officers and men of a French-Canadian battalion, which did gallant work at the capture of Hill Seventy, and had already earned high praise for its achievements at Courcellette, shows that the men of Quebec province had a full share in our recent victory. Here are some records of French-Canadian valor from the official statement as to the reasons for the award of the military medal.

gung he posted them with marked ability and kept moving from section to section, cheering his men up under heavy shelling. During an enemy counter-attack he remained with his section at a most critical spot in the line and was, to a great extent, responsible for the repulsion of the counter-attack. One can almost see through the smoke of battle the powerful frame and fearless face of Sergeant Joseph Arthur Naud, of whom the records say that in the battle of Aug. 21, on the southern slope of Hill 70, he led a party of men to the front line under intense and continuous barrage. He himself carried as much ammunition through this barrage as two ordinary men could have carried.


