### Another Dividend Up

Canadian General Electric was a member of the very select band of Canadian industrial companies which succeeded in maintaining common stock dividends when business came almost to a standstill in the early months of the war. It omitted in 1914 and 1915 the bonus of 1 per cent that had accompanied the final dividends of the year immediately preceding. But there were few Canadian concerns paying as much as the 7 per cent that Canadian General Electric distributed in regular dividends in the depressed period. In the circumstances, with the company's shares sharply stimulated in the past year, the extra 1 per cent that is to be paid with the final dividend of the current year will be regarded as conservative. There are reasons to believe that it is not in the nature of a bonus but marks the beginning of a 2 per cent quarterly rate. Until 1908 the company paid 10 per cent for a long period of years; the beginning of that year, to 7 per cent, which has remained the regular rate since, with bonuses in two years. Apparently the company is working back to the higher rate paid in the old days.

### ANACONDA COPPER

Anaconda is producing at the rate of about 300,000,000 pounds of copper a year. With the average price of 25c a pound and a 10c cost, this indicates earnings of \$24,000,000 annually, or more than \$23 a share. Anaconda thus far in 1916 has paid dividends of \$7 a share, or \$16,318,750.

The Oklahoma Producing and Refining Company has declared its regular quarterly dividend of 2 1/2 per cent, payable Dec. 23 to stock of record Dec. 13.

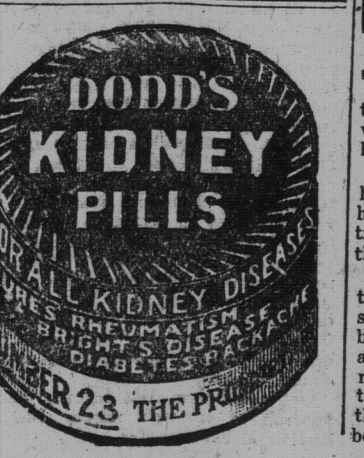

The Australians, in the recent fighting, were denounced today at the Australian headquarters as false.

That the Australians have been in hard fighting is true. They have the honor of being considered among the best troops on this front, and have been used the same as the other famous divisions.

The official representative of the Australians told the Associated Press correspondent today that they would have been aggrieved if they had been treated as inferior in organization, personnel or material. He added that the recent attacks had their natural difficulty, but that the Australians and British were side-by-side and that the heaviest

fighting fell upon the shoulders of the English, Scottish and Irish divisions. The German wireless story in characterizing recent attacks as "stupid and futile," and made solely for the sake of prestige, had overlooked the fact that the Australians brought in 7,000 prisoners, said the representative of the Australians. He added that the Australians had fought hard, and suffered along with the other good soldiers, but that they regarded it as an insult for the Germans to take up their cause. He concluded by asserting that the Germans would be delighted to create a situation under which they would be faced by no more Australians, but that this would be impossible.

The storms of the past few days have virtually brought all activities to a standstill, not even a "tank" showing itself.

## New Porcupine Merger

Toronto, Nov. 29.—Colonel Hay president of the McIntyre Porcupine mine, states that an option has been obtained upon the McIntyre Jupiter and McIntyre Extension properties. A merger basis has been agreed upon that will first have to be considered by the shareholders, respectively, of the McIntyre Extension and McIntyre Jupiter, and if approved will be submitted some time next month to the shareholders of the McIntyre Company. Colonel Hay stated that the details of the arrangement were not shaped definitely enough to give out at the present time.
