WITH THE 55TH
AT VALCARTIER

Valcartier Camp, July 29.—The biggest event since the coming of the 55th battalion to camp took place today, when an inspection of the troops was made by His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught. The duke reached the camp grounds about 9:30 a. m. and found the following units drawn up for a royal salute: The 20th, 20th, 20th, and 20th battalions, Ammunition Column, 60th battalion of Montreal, 7th Brigade including 40th, 41st, 60th, and 57th battalions. After the royal salute had been given the duke was greeted by the camp commandant, Lieutenant-Colonel John Hughes, and with the headquarters staff an inspection was made of all the lines. This was done with great care and took nearly an hour, the duke visiting every line and making minute inspection of every man. After this the troops marched past in column and returned in mass formation. Then they advanced in review order, giving the salute. At the conclusion of this, led by the camp commandant, cheers were heartily given for the king and for the Duke of Connaught. The proceedings were much enhanced by the bands of the 41st and 50th battalions. That of the 41st has been much longer organized than that of the 50th, and renders fine music, but both bands are a credit to the camp.

In today's review the mounted officers of the 55th were Lieutenant-Colonel J. R. Kirkpatrick, Major H. S. Jones, second in command; Major Donald, third in command; Major S. S. Wetmore, adjutant. "A" company was in command.

The following men have been transferred from "D" company to the staff as stretcher bearers, Privates F. Casey, C. McCarthy, A. Sheridan, H. Lockwood, E. H. Creed.

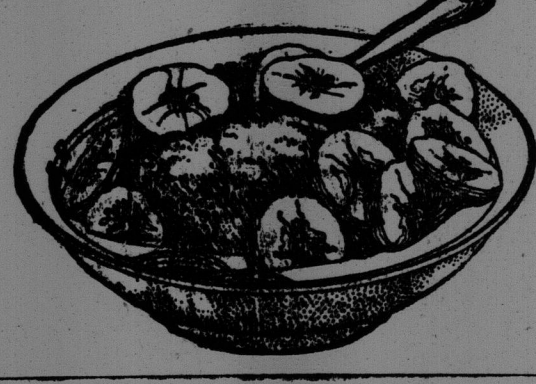

With that, Ninety-Two Years shook his head at Eighty Years and said:—"Well, you will never live to be an old man."

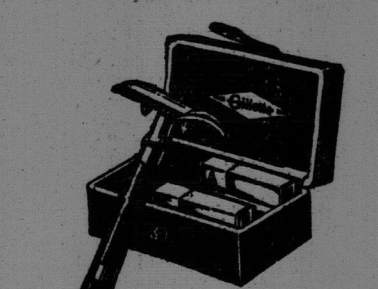

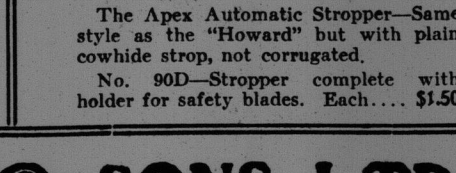
