RURAL MAIL HAS GROWN IN FAVOR

There Are 363 Farmers Now Being Served THEY LIKE IT WELL

Established Less Than Two Years Ago, Has Already Spread Over Five Counties and Applications Come Steadily in to Postal Authorities

At the present time there are 363 farmers in the province having their mail delivered at their doors through the agency of the free rural mail delivery inaugurated by the dominion government.

The system is proving very popular and many of the farmers are wondering now how they managed to get along under the old conditions when they had to walk or drive to the nearest post office to get their mail.

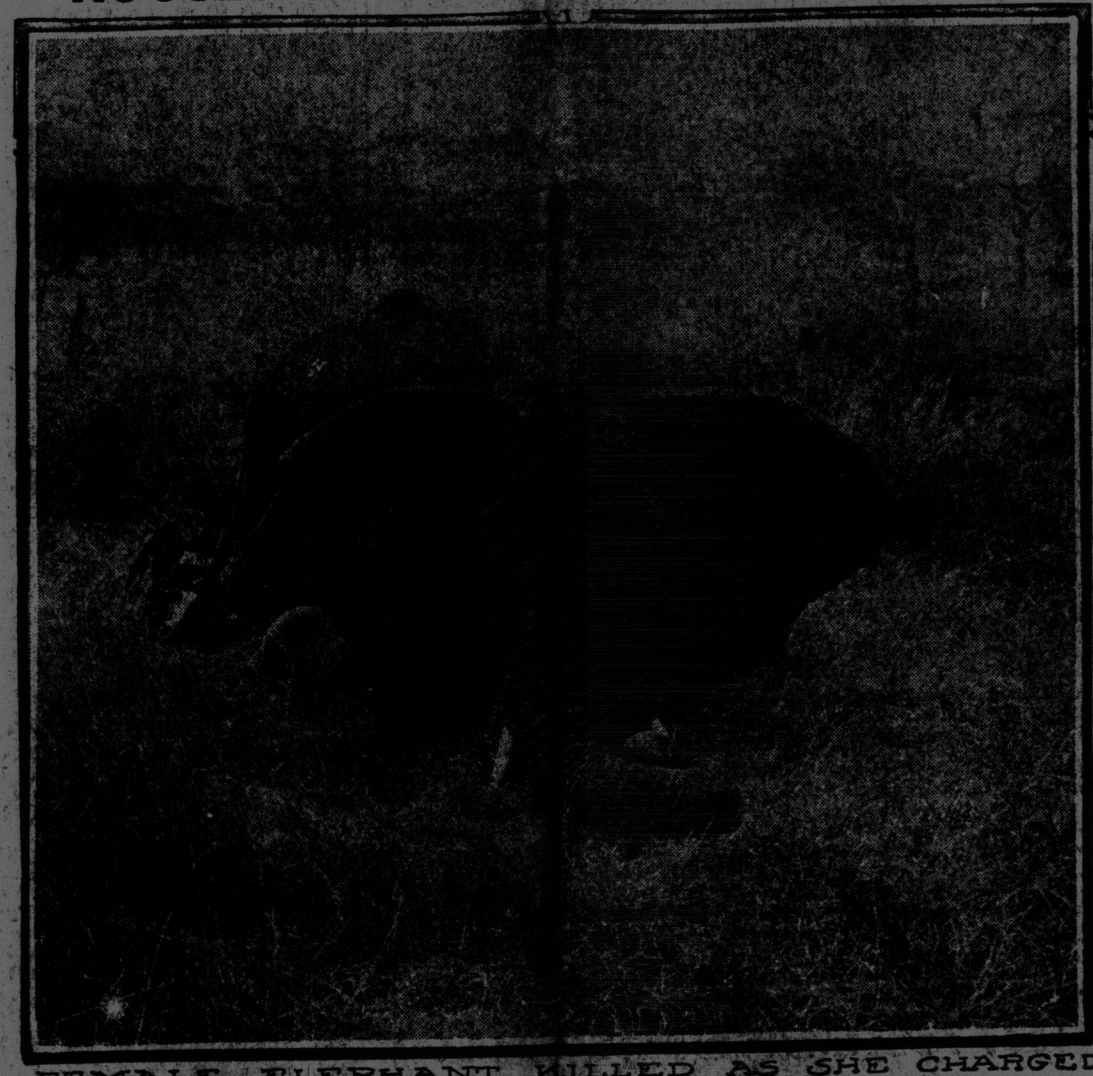
MANITOBA ELECTIONS TO BE ON JULY 20

TORONTO TO TRY REFORM OF DRUNKARD

Special Civic Committee Decides to Acquire Farm Near City and Introduce Indeterminate Sentence

Toronto, June 4.—The acquisition of a farm near Toronto and the immediate establishment of a home where habitual drunkards may be detained until the preparation of a by-law to make the plan of indeterminate sentence, apply to the institution, that an earnest appeal be made to the Ontario government for sufficient and adequate accommodation for all inmates persons whose insanity demands public restraint and treatment.
