REVOLT LEADER NAMED PREMIER OF PORTUGAL

Commander Cabecadas
Asked to Form New
Government

MILITARY COUP

Da Silva Quits Office After
Bloodless Revolution—
Public Enthusiastic

LONDON, May 31.—Commander Cabecadas, one of the most popular men in the Portuguese navy, who in 1910 contributed greatly to the establishment of the Republic by overthrowing the monarchy, is today asked to form a new government.

President Machado has requested Cabecadas to act in this capacity until the situation caused by the overthrow Saturday in the ministry headed by Antonio Maria Da Silva is straightened out.

The downfall of Da Silva, was due to a revolutionary movement in which Commander Cabecadas was one of the leaders.

The coup which resulted in the ousting of Da Silva started last week, and was carried out without the firing of a shot.

MOVEMENT REPUBLICAN

The revolutionary committee in a communication announced that the movement was purely republican and that it was begun on the basis of forming a democratic government and saving the country from politicians who were ruining it.

In addition to Commander Cabecadas, of the prime movers in the revolt, which had the support of the garrisons of Lisbon, Oporto and Braga, and the naval school on the left bank of the Tagus and the infantry school outside Lisbon.

President Machado, after the commencement of the revolt, which began at Braga, conferred with the revolutionary leaders and agreed to the formation of a new executive and legislative government, the duties of which will be the dissolution of parliament and the expunging of laws which are considered to be against national interest.

Commander Cabecadas agreed to take over the government temporarily and form a ministry of military men and civilians who do not belong to any political party.

ARMY LEADERS SUMMONED

The commander will have the post of Minister of Marine in the new government. Representatives of all the divisions of the Portuguese army have been summoned to Lisbon to discuss the new ministry.

Cabecadas last year started a similar revolt but the army failed to act with him. In 1910, when the hopes of the Republic were almost lost, Cabecadas bombarded the Royal Palace and contributed largely to the victory of the revolutionists and the establishment of the republic.

The coup of the revolutionists has been received by the public with enthusiasm.

FORKE FINDS TARIFF PROBLEMS DIFFICULT

Nova Scotia Coal Issue Hard to Solve—Learns Much of Modern Trade

TORONTO, May 31.—I have learned more about the automobile business in the last six weeks than I ever expected to learn in my life.

Robert Forke, Progressive leader, in the Federal House of Commons, said while discussing the tariff reductions on automobiles embodied in the Federal budget. Mr. and Mrs. Forke were in Toronto on their way to the Niagara fruit belt where they spent the week-end.

Western farmers, Mr. Forke said, were quite favorably inclined toward the tariff reductions on automobiles, but the problem of protection was a difficult one.

"We are supposed to be low tariff men," said Mr. Forke, "but in practice it is difficult to carry out theories."

COAL AND STEEL

"Take the coal and steel industries in Nova Scotia for instance. The simple fact is that the mines there are not economically sound. Coal is produced at an excessive cost and when it is produced it is poor in quality and yet there are half a million Canadians in the Maritime Provinces dependent on the industry. It cannot stand up on its own feet unprotected, and if the duty is removed an answer must be found to the question of what we are going to do with all those people."

IMPORTANT BATTLE PENDING IN CHINA

Gen. Feng's Soldiers Dig Trenches and Establish Lines Near Peking

PEKING, May 31.—The army of General Feng Yu Hsiang is preparing for an imminent and important battle, 11 miles north of Peking, according to Roy Chapman Andrews, the American explorer, who has returned here after having been held up by Chinese while every article of his baggage was ransacked.

Feng's soldiers came south from Hankow, Andrews said, and established lines and dug trenches. "The situation is hopeless now for moving scientific expeditions by motor transport to Mongolia," Andrews told the United Press. "Quantities of ammunition are in readiness and artillery and cavalry troops are concentrating hourly, indicating that an engagement between Feng's armies and those of Marshal Wu Pei Fu and Chang Tsoh Lin may be expected within two or three days."

Andrews was told by the commander of the Chang Fu forces in Jehol that thousands of his soldiers had turned to banditry.

ITALIAN GIRL IS BEATIFIED AT ROME

Founder of Daughters of Charity, Bartholomew Capitanze, is Honored by Church

ROME, May 31.—An Italian girl, who in the short life of 26 years became known as one of the most pious figures of the nineteenth century was honored yesterday, when Bartholomew Capitanze, founder of the Daughters of Charity, who died in 1893, was beatified in St. Peter's. The ceremony was in the presence of a large throng, including 400 members of the order she founded.

Pope Pius, accompanied by a group of cardinals, descended to the balcony to venerate relics of the new blessed.

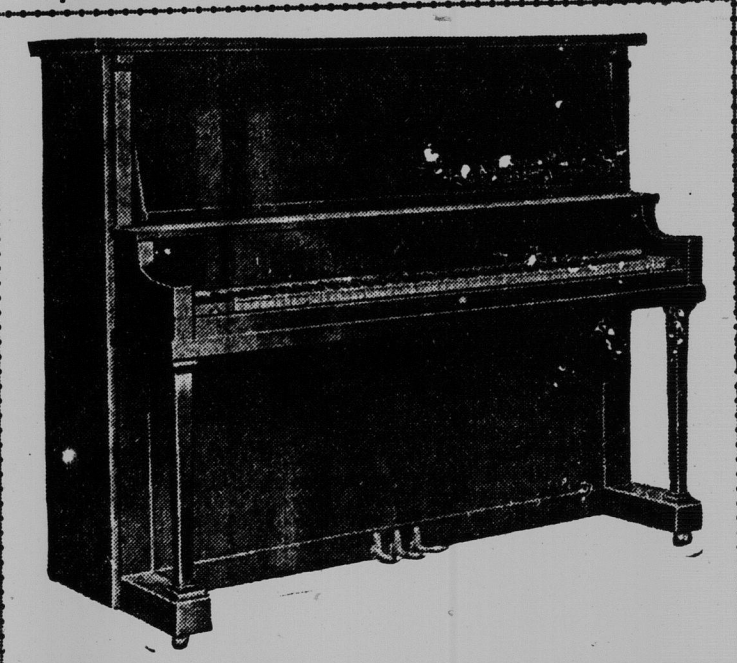

PRINCE OF WALES AIDS MINERS WIVES

Heir to Throne Sends Ten Pounds to Help Relieve Distress in Somerset

LONDON, May 31.—In token of his sympathy with the distress in the mining fields, where the men are on strike, the Prince of Wales has sent £10 to the miners' distress fund in Somerset. Accompanying the gift was a letter written by his secretary, reading: "I am commanded by the Prince of Wales to send you the enclosed check to the fund which is being raised on behalf of the wives and children of the miners of Somerset coal fields."

"His Royal Highness necessarily cannot take sides in any dispute, but we all owe a debt to the miners in the past, and everyone must feel sympathy for the wives and children in their hour of distress. Besides, it would not be a satisfactory end to any dispute that one side should be forced to give in to the other."

Yacht Reported Lost Arrives in Harbor

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla., May 31.—The open fishing yacht Casanova which left yesterday was reported lost in the Gulf of Mexico, with 24 persons on board, reached Gulfport, ten miles from here yesterday, with members of the party safe.
