REGINA SCHOOLS SOCIAL CENTRES

New Building to Be Open Night as Well as Day, Says Supt. Perret

There is a Playgrounds Association in Regina, which co-operates with the school board. Through it there should be a playground within six minutes walk of every child. One very important element in this is supervision, and an appeal has been made to the normal schools in the western provinces to provide for the training of playground teachers.

Mr. Perret said that existing school buildings could easily be made available for social centres by procuring adjustable seats. It is easy to get all the equipment necessary to convert school buildings into social centres. There is also another important consideration. With regard to libraries, the tendency now is to have a school building as a branch library than to erect a separate library building.

As an illustration of the very practical way in which the Methodist church department is setting about its social work, Mr. Dobson spoke of a week he spent in Prince Albert, speaking on Sunday and every night of the week on the Christian ideal as applied to the conditions of town planning, housing, social surveys, playgrounds, the care of the children, the care of the aged, and other subjects bearing directly on the social work.

RECENT DEATHS

A telegram yesterday afternoon to His Lordship Bishop LeBlanc bore tidings of the death of Rev. Antoine Ouellette, a retired priest, formerly of the Cathedral, where he was rector for several years. The death took place at Edmonton, Madawaska county, at the home of his sister, Mrs. Gagnon, with whom he resided since his retirement from St. John's Cathedral. Father Ouellette was a Joseph priest for years, after his departure from St. John's. He was in the vicinity of eighty years of age. He will be buried at Edmonton on Thursday.

Father Ouellette was at the St. John's Cathedral under Bishop Sweeney from 1888 until he went to Shediac in 1884. During the last six years he was at the Cathedral in St. Stephen on Friday. He retired from the ministry about four years ago and went to live with his sister in Edmonton. Father Ouellette was a man of great learning and was an able preacher.

Mrs. Edgar Hitchcock, who died recently at her home near Boston, was buried at St. Stephen on Friday. She is survived by her husband and three sisters.

Miss Sarah Caswell died in Boston last week and was buried on Friday from the residence of her father, William F. Caswell, Milltown. She leaves a husband, three sisters and three brothers.

In the death of Jacob V. Morrell, at 102 City Road, yesterday, the city loses one of its oldest and most highly respected citizens. Mr. Morrell was a Loyalist descent, was born Feb. 14, 1826, at Kara, Kings county, and moved with his family to St. John thirty-two years ago and lived an active life until the death of his wife in September, 1912, since which time he had been confined to his home.

He was well known about the city, in religion he was a staunch Baptist, being senior deacon of Waterloo street United Baptist church. He is survived by six sons and three daughters. The sons are: M. B. of Battle Creek (Mich.); I. V. of Egin (Illa.); A. W. of Boston; G. W. of St. John; J. O. of Montreal, and Louis, of Springfield (N. B.); Maria, of Boston, and Alice M., of St. John.
