THE JAIL

Within the last six months there have been many improvements made to the county jail, both to the interior and exterior. For many months prisoners have been working at painting the walls, building concrete floors and many other jobs, and the jail now presents a very clean and attractive appearance. The stairways have all been painted and varnished, and a new office fitted up for the turnkeys. The new work has been formerly the prisoners' infirmary.
