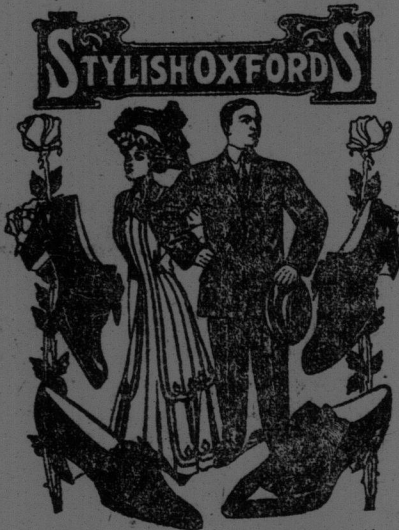

## PRESENTATIONS TO

**REV. DR. MEAHAN**

His Reply to Address by People Read in the Cathedral Last Evening

With the Cathedral crowded with members not only of his own congregation, but of other parishes, and people of other denominations as well, Rev. Dr. A. W. Meahan was tendered a farewell last evening and made the recipient of a purse containing \$1,000 in gold. His Lordship Bishop LeBlanc was on his throne in the sanctuary, and as soon as he had taken his seat and the priests and altar boys had assumed their places the presentation was made. H. O. McInerney read the address which was most beautiful and inspiring, and Timothy Collins made the presentation.

The address spoke of the general regret throughout the city at the departure of Dr. Meahan, of his zeal for his religion, his attachment to the interests of his people and his efforts in their behalf had always been appreciated and the dignified and scholarly manner in which he had attended to his duties as a priest had won the admiration of all. He was the ideal priest and his spotless life and sterling character were such as the bard of Avon contemplated: "Whose worthiness doth challenge much respect." While the people of the Cathedral and Catholics in general throughout the city were sorry to part with Dr. Meahan, they congratulated the people of St. Andrews upon gaining him for their parish priest, and extended their very best wishes for a long life of continued usefulness and success.

After the presentation had been made Dr. Meahan ascended the pulpit and in feeling terms conveyed his gratitude and appreciation. One who worthy that was the speaker said, might well feel exalted at the references, on the part of his friends, to what little service he had been able to give during his sixteen years here.

That was the human side of the matter, and what of God? Commendation of a priest's work must come from God, not man. Whatever he does, the priest's life is what God gives him grace to do; all is only the emanation of the goodness of God for His people; he is not genius or eloquence or any other quality as a priest, but Almighty God's infinite goodness. In the words of St. Paul, "By the grace of God I am what I am."

Father Meahan spoke of the high functions of the priesthood, the governing of the consciences of men handed over to a fellow man, the holding in their hands way by day the body and blood of God made man. So well he might ask what of God on an occasion such as this.

While intermingling continually with the mysteries of God, so also was the priest living in the midst of the life of the people in jeopardy; every word, every action noted, not in criticism for the love of the people, but for their priests was too great and grand for that; but he must have a watch always.

His Lordship Bishop Richardson was in charge of the ordination service in Christ Church Cathedral at Fredericton yesterday when four students were ordained to the ministry, Rev. C. G. Lawrence of Kingston, N. B., Rev. Lewis Blackall, of Mount Whately, N. B., and Rev. Frank Gaskill of Hampton. Fred Howell of St. John was ordained deacon. The preacher was Very Rev. Dean Schfield.

A. E. Smart, a native of England, who resided for a time in the city, was ordained to the priesthood in Kingston, Ont., yesterday.

A new 1500-pound bell which is now being cast to be hung in the tower of the new First Baptist Church in Bangor, Me., 100 pounds of metal taken from the ruins of the bell in the old church will be used. The bell which formerly hung in the old First Baptist church was cast in 1828.

## FLOODS CAUSE GREAT DAMAGE IN AUSTRALIA

Montreal, May 17.—A special to the Star from Sydney (N. S. W.) says: "Devastating floods are sweeping Queensland as the result of torrential rains which have fallen for the past seventy-two hours."
