Ottawa, Dec. 2—(Special)—When a vote was taken in the house at 2 o'clock this morning, on the Borden sub-amendment six opposition members voted against Borden. They are Monk, Blondin, Lortie, Gilbert, Nantel and Paquet. The vote was 126 to 70 against the amendment.

The amendment by Mr. Monk was defeated by 120 to 67. Borden and a majority of the Conservatives voted for the Monk amendment. Col. Sam Hughes being the only one who voted against it. Eight Ontario Conservatives voted with Borden but slipped out and so shirked the vote on the Monk amendment. One of these was Hon. G. E. Foster.
