Literary Fertility.—Hans Sacks was born in Nuremberg, in 1479; he was taught the trade of a shoemaker, and acquired a bate reddimental education, reading and writing; but being instructed by the master singers of those days in the prasteworthy art of poetry, he at fourteen began the practice, and continued to make verses and shoes, plays and pumps, boots and books, until the seventy-seventh year of his age. At this time, he took an inventory of his own poetical stock in trade, and found, according to his own natrative, that his works filled thrity-two folio volumes, all written with his own hand; they consisted of 4200 mastership songs; 208 comedies, tragedies, and larces, some of which esteended to seven acts; 1700 fables, tales, and miscellaneous poems; and 73 devotional, military, and losses and small. Out of these he culled as many as filled three massy folios, which were published in 1558.


