Literary Notes.

Rays of Light from Bible Lands. St. John: R. A. Morrow, 39 Garden Street.

This is a neat volume of 180 pages well printed on good paper. It embraces work by three authors. The first part of the book is occupied with brief historical sketches of the five great empires of antiquity. By Rev. H. H. Robinson, Ph.D. and Rev. Robert Wilson, Ph.D. and Rev. J. D. Wetmore.

The second part is a graphic description of the Harvest Home in Palestine or Israel's National Thanksgiving Festival and its significance, by A. O. N. B., while in the concluding portion the reader is presented with a connected record of Dr. Talmage's Tour, through and from the Holy Land.

The book presents a very readable form a variety of matter that will be of interest and value to Sabbath school teachers as well as to others who are interested in sacred history and who desire to be able to read their Bibles intelligently.
