Of the Council of the Municipality of the City and County of Saint John, passed at a Special Meeting called, and held for the purpose on the 14th February 1912, public notice is hereby given that a Bill will be presented for enactment at the next session of the Legislature of New Brunswick, the object of which is to provide that the assessment for all purposes of taxation on the Edward Partington Pulp and Paper Co., Ltd., or such other Company as shall take over and continue to operate the works, mills and undertakings of said Company in the Parish of Lancaster shall be fixed at a valuation of \$225,000, for the term of 15 years from 1st day of January 1913; this exemption to cease if said Company or other Company taking over and operating said works and mills shall not spend the further sum of \$100,000 on the plant, buildings and real estate of said Company in the Parish of Lancaster within the years 1912 and 1913 and employ continuously during the 15 year period, 50 persons additional in said parish above present average employed by said Company in said Parish.

Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, or a friend of the settler.

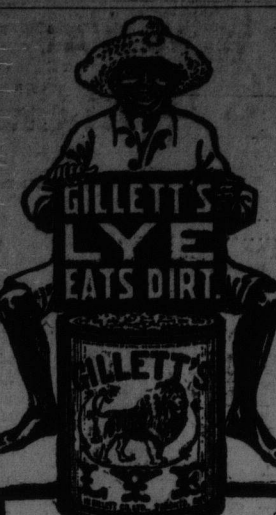

THE TRANSCONTINENTAL RAILWAY AND THE APPROPRIATE CAUSE

Hon. Mr. Fleming said that the bill as proposed did not give the Inspector discretionary powers, and that was absolutely essential in the working out of the act, provision should be made to have it inserted. Mr. Sweeney said that it would be better, in his opinion, to have the court decide whether or not the warrant should work. If it were shown that children's work was imperative to assist family, that should be sufficient justification for dismissal of the case. Children should also be given a chance to earn money to further their education.

Hon. Mr. Grimmer thought that every effort should be made to protect children. There might be many cases where children's work was needed, but there were also many cases when children were forced to work under circumstances that were not justified. There were no places so absolutely dangerous as the coal mines and health of children as factories. So far as the discretionary powers of the Inspector were concerned, he felt that no Inspector would refuse to grant an application for a warrant unless it was absolutely necessary. He had seen children coming out of factories in his own town who he realized should be at school. He would do anything in his power to bring about legislation which would not only protect these children. Under the circumstances he felt that committees should sit again on consideration of the bill.

The committee reported progress. The bill amend the act to aid the construction of the St. John Valley Railway was then taken up. Hon. Mr. Fleming in reply to Mr. Bentley said that the exact sites for bridges had not yet been determined, but that bridges would be constructed at the most advantageous points, and the act which would be introduced to provide for the construction of bridges would have to be sufficiently elastic to allow for the selection of the best sites.

Alternative Routes. Mr. Wood said that he was sorry that the bill cut out an alternative route via Wolford, which had been included in part 1 of the original act, and which would serve a large district in Queens county which had great possibilities for development, and which was deserving of consideration in this bill. He would like to have the premier add a section to the bill making it possible to adopt this route if it could be shown that such action was advisable, and if that was done he would feel more like supporting it.

Continued from page one. The House went into committee with Mr. Munro in the chair, and took up a bill to amend the N. B. factories act. Mr. LaBelle did not think it advisable that the bill should prohibit boys under 14 years of age from working in any business establishment in towns where the compulsory school law was not in vogue; this would prove a hardship, if children under 14 years of age were not compelled to attend school and were not allowed to work, they would thus be idle. Hon. Mr. Grimmer did not think that other business establishments as mentioned in the bill could be interpreted to mean ordinary places of business and would not prevent children from delivering messages or parcels. Mr. Hatheway said that the act had been promoted by some of the labor societies in St. John while others had opposed it. He did not think that it would apply to retail trade.
