

The Chester Committee has forwarded the sum of £7 10s, which, although from the particular circumstances of that Parish less than former remittances, is yet accompanied with the gratifying assurance of a gradually increasing interest in the progress of the Society.

From Sackville the same assurance has been received, and a remittance of £9—an increase upon former years.

The Committee at St. Margaret's Bay has forwarded also its punctual remittance by the hands of the Rev. J. Stanage, amounting to £5.

The Dartmouth Local Committee again deserves the most honorable mention in this Report; as, owing to the unusual exertions made, and the increased interest excited, an addition of 100 subscribers has been made to the former list, and the sum of £51 contributed to the general funds of the Society.\*
