

### SIX WEEKS TO CATCH UP

Fuel Administrator Points Out U. S. Embargo is Still in Force— American Industries Supplied

Although the strike of soft coal miners in the United States is now over, H. A. Harrington, Fuel Administrator for Outario in a statement issued declares that it will be at least six weeks before that it will be at least six weeks before Ontario consumers can hope to have an adequate supply of bituminous coal. The embargo on soft coal coming into Canada from the United States is still in force, and the few cars of coal that come in under special permit will be required to meet the needs of public utilities and hospitals.

Mr. Harrington has returned to Toronto from Montreal where he was in conference with Mr. D. H. Connor head of the fuel section of the Canadian Trade Commission, Ottawa, Mr. M. M. Mahoney, secretary of the Canadian War Mission, Washington, and Mr. J. W. Lewis, Fuel Administrator for Quebeco.

### NEWSPRINT **EMBARGO IS** CRITICIZED

Manufacturers Claim Interference With Provincial Rights .- U.S. Exports Would Help Trade Balance.

Montreal, Dec. 15.—The Canadian Puip & Paper Ass'n. headquarters in Montreal, has been notified that the Government at Ottawa is issuing a new order in council empowering the Minister of Customs to stop the exportation of newsprint paper from any manufacturer in Canada who falls to comply with any of the orders issued by the paper controller. This is the second time the embarge on export of newsprint paper has been invoked in order to enforce the rulings of the controller.

The new order arises out of attems by the paper controller to compel to manufacturers to continue supply! Notification had been sered upon the controller by certain of to manufacturers that they will cease the first of January next to suppaper in Canda on any such condition. Some of the manufacturers who had long chafed under the somewhat usual restriction put upon their is dustry are preparing to combat the latest attempts to control their right to conduct their business in their ow

to conduct their business in their own way.

Controller Pringle will have a hearing in the Windsor Hotel to-morrow for the purpose of discussing with the manufacturers and publishers the question of how next year's paper requirements of the Canadian publishers shall be met.

It is understood that at this hearing counsel for Price Bros. and Co., Ltd., of Quebec one of the largest producers of newspaper print in the Dominion, will contest the legality of the proceedings. It is said that among other things the interesting condition will be raised as to whether such control does not constitute an invasion of provin-

not constitute an invasion of provincial autonomy and that the issue will, if necessary be carried to the Privy Council for a final decision.

The issue is said to hinge upon a question of the authority of the Dominion Government to interfere with trade to the detriment of a province.
