CAYLEY, HUGH ST. QUINTON. (Calgary.)

S. of the Hon. William Cayley, Toronto. B. there 1858, and ed. at Galt and U. C. Coll. Graduated at Toronto Univ., 1881, with First Class in Metaphysics. Was engaged in journalism for some years but now practises law in Calgary. Sat in the N. W. Council 14 July, 1886 until its dissolution. Elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—Calyary, N. W. T.

CLINKSKILL, JAMES. (Battleford)

Father of an old Fifeshire family, is a consulting engineer in Glasgow, Scot. B. in Glasgow May, 1853. Ed. there and at Madras Coll. and Univ. of St. Andrews. Settled in N.W.T. in 1882. M., April, 1884. second dau. of the late Alex. Taylor of Trinidad. A merchant and a J.P. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Conservative—Battleford.

DAVIDSON, GEORGE SNIZE. (Qu'Appelle South.)

B. in the State of Ohio in 1850. Parents moved to Perth Co., Ont. two years later. Was printer and publisher of the *Listowell Banner* from 1870 to 1876. Moved to Palmerston, Ont., where he engaged in business as a general merchant, and served as a mayor of that town in 1883, when he resigned to proceed to the North West. Has since been engaged in the hotel business and farming. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. *Qu'Appelle South*.

HAULTAIN, FREDERICK WILLIAM GORDON. (Macleod.)

Second s. of the late Col. Haultain, Royal Artillery, who settled in Peterborough, Ont., and was mem. of the Leg. Assem. of Can. before Confederation. B. near Woolwich, Eng., 25 Nov., 1857. Ed. at Montreal High School; Peterborough Collegiate Institute, and Toronto Univ. Graduated B.A., 1879, with first class honors in classica. Called to the Bar, Ont., 1882; and is an Advocate, N.W. T. Settled at Macleod 1884. Elected a mem. of N.W. Council for Macleod Sept. 1887, on resignation of Viscount Boyle, and sat during the last session of the Council. Elected by acclam. to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1888. Has been a mem. of the Advisory Council. A Liberal-Conservative, but opposed to party lines in the Assem.—Macleod.
