S. of the late Rev. R. D. Cartwright, Chaplain to the Forces at Kingston, and grands. of the late Hon. Richard Cartwright, a U. E. Loyalist, who sat in the Parliament of U. C. B. 4 Dec., 1835. M. Aug., 1859, Frances, eld. dau. of Col. Alex. Lawe, late H. E. I. C. S. A director of the Canada Life Assurance Co. Was President of the late Commercial Bank of Canada. Author of a pamphlet on the Militia question. Sat for Lennox and Addington in L. A., Can., from 1863 until the Union. Returned to Commons at last g. e. An Independent Conservative.—*Kingston, Ont.; Rideau Club.*

CAYLEY, MICHAEL. [*Beauharnois.*]

B. in Kilkenny, Irel., 15 May, 1842. Ed. at the College of St. Hyacinthe. M. Miss Azilda Giroux, of Montreal. Called to the Bar, L. C., Jan., 1864. Frst returned to Parlt. at last g. e. for present seat. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir G. Cartier.—*Beauharnois, P. Q.*

CHAUVEAU, Hon. PIERRE JOSEPH OLIVIER, LL.D., Q.C. [*County of Quebec.*]

Ancestors were early settlers at Charlesbourg, near Quebec. B. in Quebec, 30 May, 1820. Ed. at the Quebec Seminary. M. 1840, Miss Masse, of Quebec. Called to the Bar, L. C., Aug., 1841.
