Ordered, That the Report be now received, and The said amendments were then read by the Clerk as follow:

Page 1. Line 25. After "St. Lawrence" insert "over which exclusive telegraph line "rights do not now exist by the law of any Province of the Dominion."

Page 6. Line 29. After "Act" insert "and whensoever and wheresoever the said "Telegraph shall pass through any wood, the trees and underwood may be cut down for "the space of fifty feet on each side of the said Telegraph upon which trees and underwood "may be."

Page 6. Line 34. After "prejudicial" insert "or woods in which trees or underwood "shall be cut down."

Page 6. Line 36. I neave out from "Act" to "The" in line 40, and insert "Provided "always that the said Company shall not out down or mutilate any tree planted or left "standing for shade or ornament, or any fruit tree, unless it be necessary so to do for the "erection, use or safety of any of its lines."

The said amendments being read a second time, and the question of concurrence put

on each, they were severally agreed to.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Allan, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Ross, it was Ordered, That the said Bill, as amended, be read a third time presently.

The said Bill, as amended, was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill as amended shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill with several amendments to which they desire their concurrence.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting the duties of Justices of the Peace out of Sessions, in relation to Indictable Offences." was read a third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day being read, for the consideration of the sixth Report of the Joint Committee of the Senate and House of Commons on the Printing of Parliament.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Odell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Christie, it was

Ordered. That the said Order be discharged from the Orders of the Day.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the House was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act to remove doubts as to "Legislation in Canada regarding offences not wholly committed within its limits."

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Locke from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill and had directed him to report the same to the House, without any amendment.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Kenny, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill without any amendment.
