Duo sets pace in MTHL play

Despite limited success in their last two Metro Toronto Hockey League starts, atom A Bates-Pasis continue as one of two Mississauga rep sides breathing the rarified air of first place.

Coming off a victorious holiday stretch, which saw them earn wins over Finchurst, 8-3, and Faustina 4-1, Bates ran into a pair of road blocks and emerged with only a single point in back-to-back encounters Friday and Saturday.

First, they crashed to Humberview, the side which trails them in third place by seven points, 5-1. On Saturday, Bates earned a 2-2 tie with Downsview to boost their top-of-the-table record to 17 wins, four ties and four defeats.

The other Mississauga rep team to occupy first place in its division is juvenile A Penman Clippers.

Clippers forced their way to a 4-3 win over East York Friday night with Doug Kozak getting the decider 42 seconds before the final buzzer.

It was Kozak's sixth goal in two starts. In an earlier 11-

2 rout against Gouling Park, the speedy forward connected for goals four times.

Joe Schaefer (2), Mike Carter (2), Mark Stobart (2), Andy Kenney, Mike Solecky and Don Raybould shared the rest in the two games that boosted Penman's record to 24 wins, two ties and a defeat.

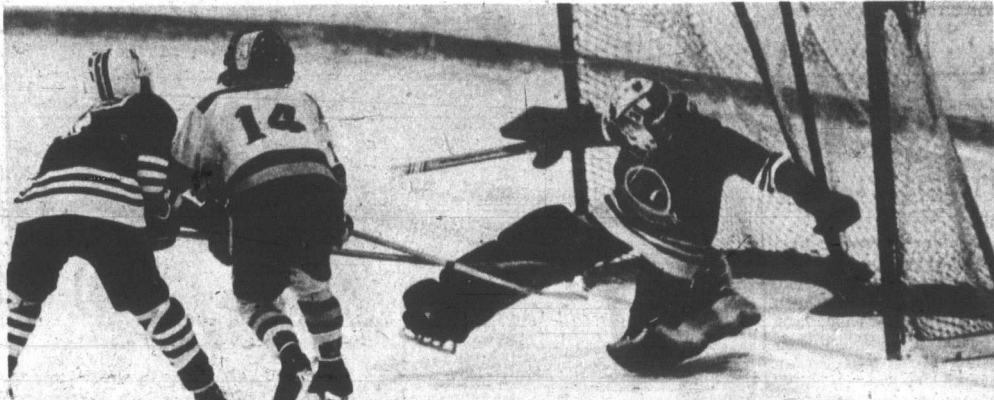
3-1, in back-to-back games.
