have not improved much durine the past seasow. Their dam, (or basket) ow the Little Laskatchewaw, for catching fish, was swept away by the high water: they had therefore to leave, and come to the Settlements, to get food and thus neglected their crops. I do not think they raised a larger quantity of grain than that which was supplied them for seed, nor had it been so well cleaned as in the year previows. They appear, how-ever to have raised more potatoes.

They have broken about six acres more this season, than last, but they sowed all their grain on the first breaking. The Church of England has excited a large, substantial building, close to the Reserve, for mission and School purposes, but it is not at present, in use. The parties who built it came back with me.
