

- 4th If the sale of the animal produces more money than is necessary to defray all legal charges, the surplus shall be paid, into the hands of the Indian Agent; but if the proceeds of the sale be insufficient to cover all charges, the poundkeepers claim shall take precedence of all others. And if at any time within six months after the date of the sale, the owner of said animal or animals should be known, the surplus amount which may be in the hands of the Indian Agent, over & above the payment of all expenses connected with the sale of the said animal or animals shall be paid to the owner thereof on application by him to the Indian Agent, but if at the expiration of six months the owner of the said animal or animals is not known, then the surplus amount which may be in the hands of the Indian agent, over & above the payment of all expenses connected with the sale of said animal or animals, shall be placed by the Indian agent, to the credit of the band in the Indian funds.
- 5th Nobody shall take up any stray animal or animals, unless such person shall be at the time a resident within the reserve, and unless such stray animal or animals shall be found doing damage on the land owned or occupied by such person, and in no case shall it be lawful for any person to bring any stray animal whether doing damage or not, from outside the reserve.
- 6th It shall be the duty of any person having a stray animal or animals whose owner is not known to him, doing damage or roaming on his premises, on or after the 20th day of November until the 15th day of April following, of each year, either to take
