Medical Visitation.

Students who are confined to their rooms by illness should send reports to 4 or 16 University Hall before 10 A.M. They will then be visited as early as possible. The nature of illness and degree of urgency should be stated. Reports requiring immediate attention should be sent by a messenger and not by mail.

Students able to go out are expected to utilize the regular consultation hours.

CONSULTATION. — The Medical Visitor may be consulted at the Physiological Laboratory, L.S.S., as follows:

8.45-9 A.M. Daily except Sunday.
4-5 P.M. Except Saturday and Sunday.
Saturday 8.45-9 A.M. and 12.45-1 P.M.
Sunday 9.30-10 A.M.

EMERGENCIES. — After 8 A.M. and before 5.30 P.M.

It should be remembered that chills and headache suggest fever and that one who has fever usually feels better in the morning, but worse again at night. It is well to consult or report early, for it may lead to the detection of serious or contagious illness and permit favorable arrangements to be made as to nursing, meals, going home, etc. Any rash or eruption should be *immediately reported*. The services of the Medical Visitor are for the benefit and protection of the student community.

The Regulations require students to report at the Office when they resume work.
