If this shift is going to take place, it is necessary in order that it may be carried out in the British Constitutional manner, that these matters be discussed with a view to guiding public opinion, so that we may not lag too far behind and create problems that might have been solved much more satisfactorily if we had gone some distance down the road to assist in providing security for the masses.

I have just agreed to act as the Companies representative on a Board of Conciliation set up for the Hamilton By-Product Coke, and the Algoma Steel Company. I have accepted these positions although the remuneration is small, but in the hopes that I can perform some real service in this broad field. I have acted on some ten boards, in nearly every instance as chairman, and have had some small measure of success and felt that when the Board was finished that I enjoyed the confidence of all parties.

I again want to thank you for memembering me with your addresses. I would have gone over and had a little chat with you in the Committee Room when I saw you, but knew you were very busy and did not like to interrupt.
