

Beach, and in respect to which, I may say, this Department is not aware of the reservation having been made for any other purpose, it is a proper one for the municipalities to deal with, and not one with which the Dominion Government should be called upon to interfere.

The Dominion Government is asked to confirm the By-laws by Order in Council. This it cannot do; but the intention may be to ask the sanction of the Government to the passage of the Railway along the Highway or Reservation of land out upon the Plans at the time of, or after the survey, by the proper authorities of the Townships as a Reserve for road purposes, the Dominion Government would no longer have control of it.
