"Where the total number of days' treatment in a year "shall exceed one thousand five hundred, the sum of eighty cents per day, for each additional day's treatment."

Would you kindly furnish me with your views on this subject and state whether you consider the proposal made by Dr. Kergin a fair one. I would like also to receive a statement from each institution to which the Department gives a grant showing the actual number of days in which attendance was given to Indians in order that it may be known what would be the total cash grant to these hospitals if Dr. Kergin's proposition is carried out.
