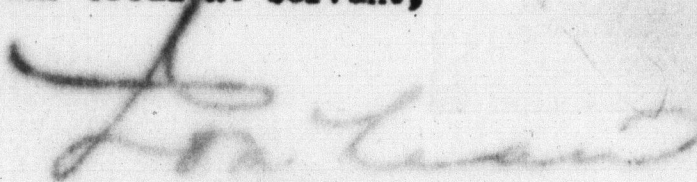
Ottawa, 4th May, 1911.

Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 24th ultimo, I beg to say that it is regretted that the little girl, Emma Jourdain, could not remain in the home of Mrs. Tremblay where you placed her. It is hoped that the present arrangement with regard to the care of the girl will prove satisfactory.

With reference to your statement that Emma has practically no underclothing and requires the articles which you mention, I beg to say that you may arrange to purchase for her such articles of wearing apparel as she requires to keep herself clean. With reference to your remark that she requires corsets and a coat, I have to draw your attention to the fact that in the account, which you submitted recently from the Good Shepherd's at Montreal for clothing for the girl, there is a charge of \$8.25 for a dress and coat, and a charge of .75¢ is also made for corsets.
