All vessels lying at anchor in the harbor or roadstead shall keep Vessels at anchor to dis a clear and bright light burning, at a height of at least six feet from the spar deck, from sunset to sunrise of each day. play lights.

Provision All vessels loading or discharging in the stream, coals, ballast, against letting and such like material, shall have a sufficient piece of canvass or tarcargo fall into paulin so placed as to prevent any portion thereof from falling into the harbor. the harbor.

ARTICLE XXI.

Vessels to dis-All vessels shall discharge ballast at the place, places, pier, or charge ballast wharves set apart or designated by the Harbor Master, and no ballast stone, gravel, earth or rubbish of any kind shall be unladen, discharged, deposited, thrown or laden before sunrise or after sunset.

ARTICLE XXII.

Ballast, rubbish &c., not to be thrown into harbor or docks,

No ballast, stones, dirt, filth or rubbish of any kind shall be unladen or emptied out of vessels or thrown into any of the docks between the wharves or into the harbor, or from any ship or vessel whatsoever into the roadstead of the burbor, within a linedrawn from within Cranberry Head to Low Point Light House in the said county of certain limits. Cape Breton.

ARTICLE XXIII.

Landing of gumowder: how regulated.

No gunpowder shall be landed until there be on the wharf a suitable vehicle in readiness at the place to convey it away promptly, and such powder shall be passed from the ship or vessel containing it directly into the vehicle prepared for its reception, and no greater quantity shall be landed than what is sufficient to load such vehicle once, until the quantity placed therein shall be taken away, and such vehicle shall depart within five minutes from the time of having received the quantity of powder intended for it at that time.

ARTICLE XXIV.

Landing and earrying of

No gnnpowder shall, be conveyed to or from any vessel in an open boat unless it be completely covered over with tarpaulin or gunpowder by other suitable covering, and no person on board such boat or boats shall strike a light, smoke a pipe, kindle a fire in any manner, nor shall permit fire to be passed on board or used therein for any purpose whatever.
