Synopsis of Canadian North-West. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

NY even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, ex-cepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any per-son who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or leas. 10.00

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominon Lands Agency or Sut-Agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy, may, however, be made at any Agency on certain condi-tions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTTES. -(1) At least six months' residence upon and cul-tivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint owner-shir in land will not meet this re-quirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the bove while living with parents or on farm-ing land owned by himself must notify the agent for the district of such intention.
