Mr. Tames Cuthbert reported from the Committee to whom the petition of Thomas Porteous of Terrebonne, in the County of Effingham. Esquire, was referred; that the Committee, had examined the matter of the faid petition, and had directed him to report the fame, as it appeared to them, to the House; and he read the report in his place. and afterwards delivered it in at the Clerk's Table: where the same was read and is as followeth, videlicet:

That in support of the allegations contained in the petition, several Members prefent informed your Committee, that the delay is very confiderable, and the dangers of croffing that branch of the river Ortawa, which seperates the Island of Montreal from the main land of the County of Leinster, some times emminont; arising equally from the great breadth of the river, and the quantities of ice floating down in the fpring and fall of the year. For the control of the server (in committee the projection

To obviate these difficulties and facilitate the communication, there can be no remedy so well calculated as the erection of a Bridge.

Your Committee observe from their own personal knowledge, that vessels of about eighty tons burthen, navigate, during the high waters of the foring only, that branch of the river which flows between the Island of Montreal and the Isle Bourdon; and that to your Committee it appears necessary, should a Bridge be erected, it should be so constructed as to permit such vessels to pass and repass.

That in regard to the Tariff for croffing, in canoes and batteaux, that part of the river over which it is proposed to creek a Bridge-Your Committee are informed by feveral of their own Members, that for crossing in a canoe, a fingle person pays $7d\frac{1}{2}$, and each additional perfon as much more. That in a batteaux, a fingle person pays 2/6, and each additional passenger 1/3 more.
