About the House of Refuge

The Bruce County House of Refuge nas about fifty inmates at present, which is the general average. The board is provided at a weekly average cost of \$1.62 per inmate. Last year there was 40 acres of farm land cropped in connection with the institution, the inmates assisting in the work. Some of the products were:-12 tons of hay, 2,000 bushels of mangolds, 45 bushels of wheat, 200 bushels of barley, 755 bushels of oats, 150 bags of potatocs, 2 acres of butter, 334 doz of eggs, 1,000 lbs of pork. The institution produces its own milk, butter and pork entirely. At the barn are 7 milch cows, 2 horses, 5 hogs and 100 hens.
