SALE OF OPTICAL GOODS.

Rules Governing the Sale of Optical Goods.

(1) Every person, not being a holder of a certificate under this Act, who, after a day to be fixed by the Lieutenant-Governor by proclamation—

(a) Appends to his name the term "optometrist" or "optician," or any abbreviation thereof, or wilfully or falsely pretends to be, or wilfully or falsely takes or uses any name, title, addition, abbreviation or description implying or calculated to lead people to believe that he is, or is recognized by law as an optometrist or optician, or that he is registered or possesses a certificate under this Act; or

 (b) Having been prohibited from carrying on business as an optometrist or optician, disobeys such prohibition; or

(c) Sells, or fits, or supplies glasses by going from house to house or from place to place, or in any other manner than from a permanent place of business, and notwithstanding that he is the holder of a municipal license as a peddler or transient trader;

shall be guilty of an offence and shall incur a penalty of not more than \$100 or less than \$10.
