He is not always there to see, and in fact a plumbing inspector would prove a good thing for the master plumbers, as they would in this way be able to ascertain when their men were not doing their work properly. The good plumber should have nothing to fear from a plumbing inspector, and such an officer would he hailed with delight by the first-class workman.
