Reamship Kreenland Though Struck By a "dal Wave Acrives.

New York, Dec. 21.—After a tempestubus voyage, in which she was struck by a tidal wave, the Red S.ar Line steamship Kroonland arrived here today from Antwerp. When the tidal wave struck the ship one of her passengers was thrown across the deck and had a leg broken and a sailor fell from the crew's nest, but suffered no serious injury. On the second day out a stewardess went insane and was paced under restraint. The voyage was the worst the vessel has ever experienced. There was nothing but bad weather from the time she left Antwerp on the 10th until she neared port. Hurricane followed harricane and heavy head seas were almost continually breaking over her bows and retarding her passage.

On the morning of the 12th, while the vessel was making fair time in a strong northwest gale, she was struck by a standing under shelter and close to the deckhouse amidships. When rescued it was found that his leg had been broken in two places.

Officers of the Kroonland say that when the wave struck the vessel the water dashed higher than her funnels and swept the hurricane deck. Fri's Sørtland, the lookout, was thrown out of the crow's nest and fell a distance of 40 feet, but sustained no injury, except a badly bruised side.
