## BRITISH LIBERALS.

### The South African War Divides the Party Into Two Hostile Camps.

### A Noisy Scene at the National Liberal Convention at Derby.

#### THE RESOLUTIONS AGRÉED UPON.

NEW YORK, Dec. 5.—The chaotic condition of the Liberal party was never more noticeable than at the meeting of the National Liberal Federation at Derby, says the London correspondent of the Tribune. A resolution calling on the government to announce the terms on which they were prepared to conclude peace in South Africa was not passed without a noisy scene, occasioned by differences of opinion in regard to the attitude taken by Lord Milner.

Mr. Emmett, Liberal member for Oldham, objected to the words declaring it essentially important to the

conclusion of peace that a commissioner should be despatched to South Africa. Cheers and groans greeted his statement that he would accept no vote of censure on Lord Milner, and the chairman was forced to intervene to restore order.

As a matter of fact the differences between the various sections of the Liberal party are not differences on mere matters of detail, nor are they the result of the war. The dissolution of the party began in 1885, and the war has hastened its progress, which was retarded for a time by Mr. Gladstone's personal influence.

#### TO SUPPRESS ANARCHY.

U. S. Senate Will Consider Sweeping Measures to Put Down Anarchy.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—Practically the entire time of the Senate to day was devoted to the introduction of bills and resolutions. Two of these measures, relating to the suppression of anarchy and methods of dealing with anarchists were allowed to lie upon the table so that their respective authors, Mr. McComas of Maryland and Mr. Vest of Missouri, may bring them to early attention of the senate.

The resolution introduced by Senator Vest in the senate directs the judiciary committee to inquire if congress has power to legislate for the punishment of anarchists who assassinate or attempt to assassinate the president of the United States, and if not, whether it is expedient to amend the federal constitution to enable congress so to legislate. Also, whether it is necessary and expedient, so to amend the federal constitution so as to empower congress to prevent, by such means as may be deemed necessary the teaching by anarchists of the doctrine that all governments should be destroyed; also whether it is necessary and expedient so to amend the federal constitution that congress shall have power to punish all persons belonging to anarchical associations; also what amendments, if any, are necessary to the naturalization laws to prevent the coming into this country of anarchists and their becoming citizens of the United States; also whether it is necessary or expedient so to amend the federal constitution as to give congress the power to establish a penal colony on some suitable island under the jurisdiction of the United States, to which, after trial and conviction, every anarchist holding the doctrine that all governments should be destroyed by the assassination of their chief rulers, shall be deported; and that the committee after due examination and inquiry shall recommend to the senate such amendments to the federal constitution as may be necessary to prevent the teaching and promulgation of anarchical doctrines in the United States.

#### TROOPS AT HALIFAX.

Orders That Royal Canadian Regiment are to Remain Re-enlistment Next March.

HALIFAX, Dec. 4.—Word has been received from Ottawa to the effect that the Royal Canadian Regiment will continue to do duty for another year at least. The men in the regiment at present enlisted last March for one year, and in March of next year qualifying for re-enlistment for another year. The militia authorities, however, reserve the right to disband the regiment at any time within the year, but must give officers and men a month of a month or two months' pay. It looks as though the Royal Canadians will stay here until the termination of the war.

#### REGULATING WAR NEWS.

Correspondents Will Be Uniformed and Limited in Future.

LONDON, Dec. 5.—The military authorities are taking steps with a view to adopting more stringent regulations in regard to war correspondents. It is intended, in future, to restrict the number of press representatives at the seat of war, while a list is to be kept at the War Office of those who are officially considered qualified to act in that capacity. Furthermore, the authorities in Pall Mall have resolved that in any future campaign newspaper men be the front shall wear a uniform, the precise nature of which has, however, yet to be decided. Lord Stanley, Under Secretary for War, has met in consultation on the whole question representatives of London dailies who have had experience in military affairs in South Africa, in order that their wishes and feelings might not be entirely overlooked. At this conference the subject in its various aspects came under prolonged discussion, and the correspondents present secured the concession that, in future, no officer under the rank of a Major shall be entrusted with the delicate duties attached to the office of press censor.

#### FIVE LADS HIDE-AWAY.

Five boys, named James and Thomas Rodgers, aged sixteen and fourteen, Harry Dougherty, aged fifteen, Samuel Murray, aged sixteen, and Thomas Stone, aged sixteen, all sons of seafaring men, disregarding the wishes of their parents, boarded the steamer Baroda Tuesday morning and hid themselves among the coal and sailed for South Africa. Their parents are greatly worried and are making efforts to have them sent back from St. Vincent or St. Helena.

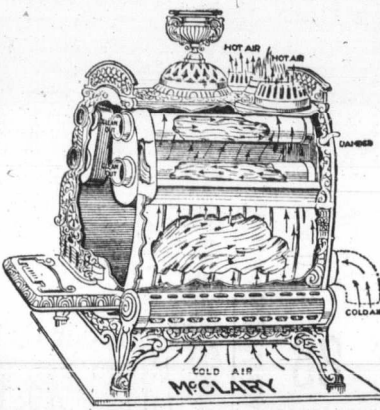
