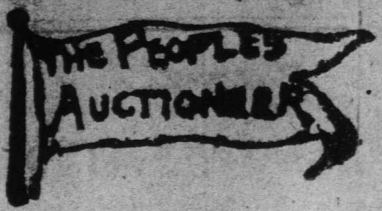

PRELIMINARY NOTICE.
