Liner Florizel **Had Close Call**

Of Being Torpedoed - Within the Small Margin of a Couple of Hours Was She Missed by German Armed

The Red Cross Liner Florizel Capt. RED CROSS CHOSE STEPHANO, Martin, arrived here from New ADMIRALTY FLORIZEL. W. Has Son Nine Years in The Navy.

Mr. Robert Wells, 66 years of age, a resident of Jamestown, arrived by the express yesterday to enter the general hospital for treatment to his left eye. Mr. Wells has one son, Theophilus, who for the past nine years has served in the Royal Navy, and when last heard from was in the Dardanelles. The letter was written August 4th, the second anniversary of England's declaration of war against Germany, and expressed the hope that by that date 1917 the war would be over. Reservist Wells was in the thickest of the fight in the landing of the Anzas on the Gallipoli Peninsula, and had his clothes and boots riddled with bullets, but escaped without serious injury.


