Upon the recommendation of the Food Control Board, and under the Provisions of the Food Control Act, 1917, and the War Measures Act, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following Regulations regarding the Importation, Sale and Consumption of Breadstuffs.

(1) In these Regulations
(a) "breadstuffs" shall mean wheat flour, rolled oats, oat-meal, corn-meal of the quality known as granulated or bolted table meal, and corn-flour; and "substitutes" shall mean any or all of the foregoing, except wheat flour.
(b) "person" shall mean any individual, firm, partnership, or corporation.
(c) "importer" shall mean any person duly licensed by the Food Control Board under these Regulations.

(2) From and after this date no person shall import any "breadstuffs" into the Dominion unless he shall have first obtained a license so to do from the Food Control Board. Such license shall be issued without charge.

(3) No importer shall import any such breadstuffs without previously obtaining a permit from the Food Control Board for each and every quantity of breadstuffs he may desire to import.

(4) Every permit so issued shall authorize him to import wheat flour and substitutes in the proportion of four-fifths of wheat flour, and one-fifth of substitutes.

(5) Any importer, who, prior to the issue of these Regulations, shall have purchased abroad for import into this Dominion any wheat flour, may be granted by the Board a permit for the importation of the same on an undertaking by him that he will import within two months thereafter substitutes to the extent of twenty per cent. of such imports of wheat flour, and if such person has made contracts with any dealers within this Dominion for the supplying of such wheat flour, or any portion thereof to such dealers, he shall be regarded as satisfying the terms of such contracts if he furnishes four-fifths of the flour on its arrival, and the remainder in the form of substitutes within two months thereafter. The kind and proportion of such substitutes shall be settled by agreement between the parties, and if they find themselves unable so to agree, by the Food Control Board.

(6) When any importer shall satisfy the Food Control Board that he has not any agency or connection through which he can purchase the required proportion of substitutes to justify the issue of a permit to allow him to import wheat flour, the Food Control Board may, on being satisfied that he has purchased the requisite stock of substitutes through any other person or firm in St. John's, grant him a per-

mit to import such wheat flour.
(7) The Food Control Board may, at any time, if satisfied that applications for excessive quantities of flour and substitutes are being filled, with the result that the purposes of these Regulations may be defeated, or complications caused by the Canadian or United States Food Control Departments, issue permits for only part of the quantities set out in such applications, or decline to issue permits for any such quantities.

(8) On and after Wednesday, July 10th, 1918:—

(a) Every merchant, planter, trader, broker, commission agent, provision dealer, grocer, shop-keeper, or any other person in Newfoundland who shall sell or deliver to any other person any wheat flour, shall only do so in the proportion of not less than one pound of substitutes to every nine pounds of wheat flour; and

(b) Every person in Newfoundland who makes for public or private consumption, bread, cake, rolls, pastry or other product in which wheat flour is used shall, in making the same, use not less than one pound of substitutes to every nine pounds of wheat flour.

(9) On and after Monday, August 5th, 1918:—

(a) Every merchant, planter, trader, broker, commission agent, provision dealer, grocer, shop-keeper, or any other person in Newfoundland who shall sell or deliver to any other person any wheat flour, shall only do so in the proportion of not less than one pound of substitutes to every four pounds of wheat flour.

(b) Every person in Newfoundland who makes for public or private consumption bread, rolls, cake, pastry or other product in which wheat flour is used shall, in making the same, use not less than one pound of substitutes to every four pounds of wheat flour.
(10) No person selling breadstuffs shall after this date offer for sale any wheat flour, unless he also has at all times a sufficient stock of one or other of the substitutes abovesaid to meet the demands of his customers at reasonable prices.

(11) Any person authorized by the Newfoundland Food Control Board, or any constable or peace officer, may seize any bread, cake, rolls, pastry or other product in which wheat flour is used, the composition of which is contrary to these regulations, and the same shall be confiscated and disposed of in such manner as the said Board may from time to time direct.

(12) Any person violating any of the provisions of these Regulations is guilty of an offense and shall be liable on summary conviction before a magistrate or justice of the peace to a penalty not exceeding one thousand dollars, or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months, or to both fine and imprisonment, (one-half the fine shall be paid to the informer, and the balance to the Food Control Board for the benefit of the Dominion.

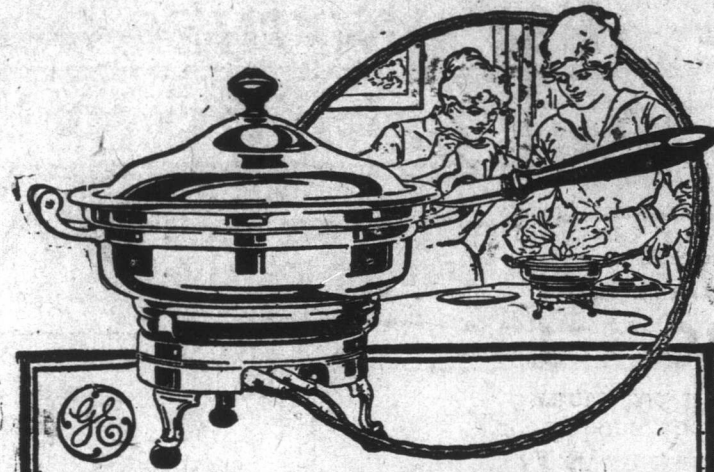
