BRITAIN STILL IN IT

Commercial Invasion. Toronto, Aug. 1.-The alleged American invasion of England was referred to in an interview yesterday by James Weir, head of the great engineering firm of G. & J. Weir, of Catheart, Scotland, who is in the city on a visit. He says that Britain does not fear the competition of the world, but thinks Chamberlain's plan can be used as a club for the nations which persist in putting tariff walls up against Britain. As for American competition against Britain, Mr. Weir said it did amount to a row of pins English firms beat American firms in all parts of the world.
