## PROPOSES CONCERTS AND MUSICALS TO BUILD BAND STAND

E. V. Buchanan Suggests Plan  
To Meet Needs At Victoria  
Park.

## OVERCOME OBJECTIONS

Whole Cost Could Be Met by  
the Lovers of Music.

General Manager E. V. Buchanan, of the public utilities commission, has a scheme whereby it is possible for London to acquire a new bandstand in Victoria Park to replace the dilapidated structure which now attempts to serve that purpose. This scheme will not throw any extra taxation upon the ratepayers of the city, but funds will be provided by lovers of music here, if carried into effect successfully.

"My scheme is to have a series of concerts and musicals staged in Victoria Park by local talent, volunteering services gratis," Mr. Buchanan informed The Advertiser. "A collection could be taken up each time, and before long funds would be provided for the new bandstand."

"I have heard it said that a city of the size of London should vote sufficient money to build a modern bandstand. But all Londoners are not lovers of music to such an extent that they would stand for their tax rate to be increased for a bandstand in Victoria Park without the necessity of a series of music attending these concerts, and letting their money's worth, and lovers of music providing the funds for the improvement could be provided indirectly."

A citizen residing in East London might possibly object to paying taxes for a new bandstand in Victoria Park. However, if he appreciated good music, he would come to the park to hear a treat, and be willing to pay for it. A few concerts would soon accumulate the necessary funds, if musicians of the city would get together and work out this plan.

Mr. Jordan of the Institute of Musical Art might be prevailed upon to stage a musical in the park on a big scale, as one of the series. Mr. Slater might stage a concert with his band. Mr. Roselle Pockocke do likewise with the Grand War Veterans, Royal Canadian Regiment, Marconi and other bands taking a turn in the series.

"Sufficient local talent could be obtained to stage two or three concerts in the series of concerts. By these means I feel confident that before long the cost of a new bandstand which can range according to what is desired from \$5,000 to \$10,000, would be met. The idea is worth taking up."

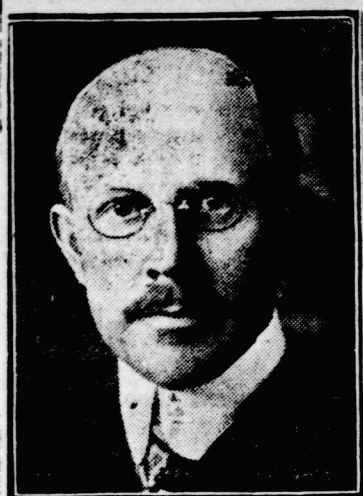
## EXPECT TO EFFECT SPURGIN'S ARREST IN A SHORT TIME

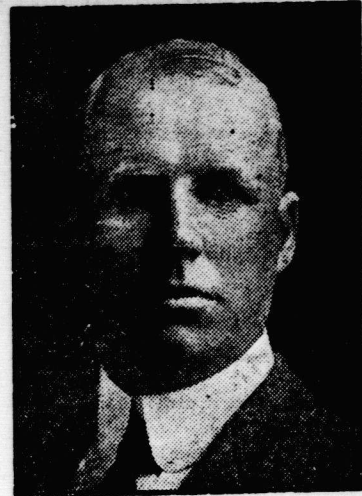

## LACK OF FUNDS WILL KEEP MANY MEN FROM WEST

Railway and Employment Officials Report Prospects of Big Trek.

"Not good enough, eh? Well, what do you know about that?" questioned a disgruntled worker, standing outside the employment bureau this morning, after reading a dispatch from Winnipeg that farmers of Manitoba were experiencing the utmost difficulty in getting out-of-work men to bestir themselves and "take on" at five dollars a day, and everything found for harvest work in that district. Sixty dollars a month, it is further advised, is the ruling figure for steady work on Manitoba farms.

It is intimated that crowds of unemployed in the western city are refusing to accept work until they are paid seven and eight dollars a day, and are guaranteed 30 days' work. The farmers, it is explained, are as a result anxiously awaiting the arrival of the annual exodus from Ontario and the east.

Many Londoners going.

Increasing inquiries as to dates of departure, and other particulars indicate, railway and employment agencies affirm, that the London quota for the prairie provinces will be substantial. Quite a number, however, as in other centers, explain that as they have been without work for many months, it will be only with the greatest effort that they will be able to secure the necessary finances for the trip. The Government obviously will make no effort to act upon the suggestion of the executives of certain returned soldier bodies to grant free passage.

Those enlisting for the trip through the local employment bureau are advised that the agent in the bureau of their chosen destination will be acquainted with their departure here, and will be amply prepared with waiting farmers to take them in charge immediately and have them at work without undue loss of time.

## TWO MONUMENTS AND INDIVIDUAL CROSSES FOR SOLDIERS' GRAVES

Permanent Crosses to Replace Wooden Ones Now in Use.

Military authorities of Military District No. 1 expect word any day to the effect that the crosses for soldiers' graves in the local cemeteries will be ready for shipment from Ottawa to London, they are expected to be erected in place of the wooden crosses now being used.

Major W. T. Lawless, A. G. M. D. No. 1, stated that the crosses for soldiers' graves in the local cemeteries, erected in one of the Protestant cemeteries, and in the Roman Catholic Cemetery.

While it is expected that the individual crosses will be available in a short time, it is not thought that the erection of the monuments will take place until the fall.

Two clearances will be made from the street letter boxes, commencing at 7:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.

Money order, saving bank and postal note windows will be closed the entire day.

## BOY SCOUTS TO HOLD SERVICE ON VILLAGE SQUARE AT BAYFIELD

London Troop Will Be Joined by Several District Troops.

As the time draws near for the closing of the Boy Scouts' camp at Bayfield, great interest is being taken in the service to be held on Sunday afternoon on the village square. All the London boys will participate, and many more scout troops, with their leaders, from the surrounding district, will also take part. The choir boys of the Church of St. John the Evangelist will be in charge of the musical services, which will be under the direction of a Godefrid orchestra. Many hundreds will visit Bayfield for the service, and with the large number of summer visitors now at the lakeshore, a large attendance is looked for.

During the past week the boys in camp have been holding long hikes, being sent out under sealed orders, which were opened at the designated point, the place usually being the home of some hospitable resident, who assisted greatly in giving the boys a royal welcome. The hikes have been a feature of the work, and a number of the scouts are passing their signal tests successfully. The health of the camp has been excellent, sunburn being the only "epidemic," which cases were carefully attended to by the medical officer, Mr. Watson. "Ting," the corpulent and good-natured chef, has become a great favorite with the boys on account of the many delicacies which he has furnished the campers, even plum pudding being on the menu. And the "flapjacks" he produces—about two feet in diameter—have made many of the boys forget the dainty, pink-tinted affairs they have been in the habit of obtaining at home.

Campfire stories, some of which are remarkable for their apparent attempt at reality, are told each night, followed by short prayers and a singsong conducted by Rev. A. S. H. Cree and S. McKegney. Rev. Carew Holloway makes scout work a special feature, in which he is ably assisted by T. K. Wright, a London divinity student.

On Monday the Girl Guides will go into camp on the same site, and will remain for ten days. Rev. A. L. G. "Cler," of the Church of St. John the Evangelist, is at present in the city arranging for the homebound transportation of the boys on that day, and a number of the parents of the boys will be visitors over the week-end. Altogether the venture has been a success in every way, and gives much encouragement to the endeavor now being made to make the camp an annual affair, with a much increased attendance.

## LONDON LAUNDRY WORKERS BEST PAID IN ONTARIO

Wages Paid in Other Places Reported Below New Minimum.

Laundry workers of London, according to the official report of the Ontario minimum wage board sitting in Toronto, appear to be in a better position comparatively than their fellow workers throughout the province. At Thursday evening's meeting of that body it was pointed out that in several instances the minimum scale now agreed upon by both employers and employees of Ontario is far below the actual scale now in existence and London was singled out as a notable example in this respect. It was suggested that the new orders governing female laundry workers in all communities outside Toronto, be put in effect on September 1. This date was acceptable, it is advised, to the representatives of the employees themselves.

"That is quite right," commented Roy W. Williams, manager of the Parisian Steam Laundry, today. "Conditions in London are very good in this respect. We have had this scale in effect for a considerable period, and our employees appear to be well satisfied. When we have them remaining on our payroll for long periods, it is a fairly good sign, is it not? Why, we have one employee who has been with us for 30 years now." Seven dollars is the minimum under the new ruling for the first six months for an inexperienced person employed in a laundry, under 18 years of age. After the stipulated length of employment the worker is accordingly raised in accordance with the scale as laid down by the act.

## LOCAL FIRM MAY GET CONTRACT FOR SCHOOL BOILERS

Members of No. 2 committee of the board of education in session this afternoon will in all probability recommend the contract for boilers for the new Victoria School, now under construction. While the committee is understood to unanimously favor the water-tube type of boiler, as seen by members on a recent visit to Montreal, it is pointed out that any firm can construct the solid type of boiler to specifications laid down, and under these circumstances, if conditions warrant same, a local firm will likely be awarded the contract.

In addition to this item on the agenda, replacement of beams which have rotted at the Simco street public school, will also be considered at the meeting.

## MORE BATHING SUITS DONATED; STILL MORE, HOWEVER, ARE NEEDED

In response to the appeal for bathing suits to be utilized by local kiddies picking at the north end bathing camp, Secretary E. H. Lance of the soldiers' aid commission has handed 27 children's bathing suits and 9 suitable for adults to the public utilities for use at "the valley." These suits were in service at the soldiers' aid commission camp at Port Stanley last year.

This donation makes a total of 60 suits given to the city for the bathing camp. The suits are furnished free of charge to the youngsters of all parts of the city attending the bi-weekly picnics at the north end camp, but the attendance is so great at these outings, that late coming youngsters are denied a bathing suit, and a cooling dip in the Thames.

Any public-spirited citizen desirous of donating bathing suits in any size or quality may do so, by getting in touch with General Manager E. V. Buchanan of the public utilities commission, or G. Mel Brock, chief supervisor of public playgrounds.

CONVICTION IS QUASHED.  
Toronto, July 28.—Judge Morson today quashed the conviction of the \$1,000 fine of W. P. Fraser, secretary-treasurer of the Ontario Jockey Club, made by Magistrate Cohen in police court for having liquor for sale on the premises of the Jockey Club.

Judge Morson says that it was not pretended either in police court or before him that Fraser, on the Jockey Club kept liquor for sale.

"The language of section 53 is not, in my opinion, very clear, and I prefer to assume that the Legislature, in the absence of direct enactment, never intended that an innocent person should suffer for the guilt of another."

The judge declares that the conviction is bad for want of sufficient evidence.
