WASHINGTON, Jan. 20 .- The Am erican proposal to lay openly before the world all the treaties and understand ings that related to China met with an nexpected setback today when it came before the far eastern committee of the rms conference for formal adoption. Although such a step had been agreed yesterday "in principle" the problem of defining the exact scope of the agree ment precipitated a long debate, and after several changes had been made in the draft presented by the American delegation final action was postponed at the suggestion of Japan.

The committee did adopt, however resolution expressing the hope of the powers that China would speedily re luce the large military forces nov naintained within her borders. That action, the resolution declared, was considered requisite to any real financia

United States in the near future.






