CANADA'S GREAT HARVEST OF THE SEA

Canada's sea harvest increases in value. In May, 1925, \$7,264,000 lbs. of sea fish were landed on both coasts and the value of the catch, \$2,532,165, is nearly a million dollars better than in May 1924.

On the Atlantic Coast the catch of mackerel, cod and haddock was plentiful and the lobster fishing brought more than twice the catch in the previous May, in spite of rough weather towards the end of the month.

On the Pacific coast, 1,694,000 lbs. of salmon were taken, compared with 927,400 pounds in May 1924. The bulk of the salmon catch was sold fresh.
