The sub-committee appointed for the purpose of examining candidates for the office of plumbing inspector reported that eight persons presented themselves, and of this number they selected three: Benjamin Kirk, Cleveland: W. H. Meadows, Toronto, and J. Watson Mashenter, Toronto. They also suggested that in view of the rapid increase of Toronto two of the three should be appointed at about \$1000 per annum each, rather than one inspector at a high salary. After some discussion it was decided not to adopt the recommendation, but to confine the appointment to one. Ald. Macdonald proposed that the first name on the list be accepted, presuming that the order of precedence was regulated by Mr. Kirk's superior qualifications. Ald. Carlyle supported the appointment of a Toronto man and proposed that W. H. Meadows be recommended for the office. A poll was taken which resulted in the selection of Mr. Meadows.

Dr. Canniff complained that a member of the board had case reflections upon him as to the manner in which he discharged his duties with reference to the Lamb glue factory, and quoted from a city paper in substantiation of his complaint. The member alluded to was Ald. Macdonald.

Ald. Macdonald said that his remarks were not intended for publication, and assured the doctor that he had no intention whatever of casting any slur on him—quite the contrary. The doctor accepted the explanation.
