A decrease of 1,500,000 bushels in the visible supply of wheat is expected on Monday. During the corresponding week of 1893, the visible supply was 3,275,000 bushels.

There were 24 failures in Canada this week, against 30 last week, 20 in the third week of June, 1893, and 26 in the like week of the year before last.

Exports of wheat, flour included, both coasts, amount to only 2,000,000 this week, against 2,574,000 bushels last week, 3,350,000 bushels the third week of June, 1893, and 2,457,000 bushels in the week of 1892.

Stocks and Bonds. The local market is easy at 4 1/2 per cent. At Montreal the rates are 4 to 4 1/2, at New York and at London 5 per cent.

Butter—The market is quiet, with sale of feed outside at 30c.

Jobbing prices: Chickens, from 50c to 60c per pair, and turkeys 10c to 11c per lb.

Apples and Vegetables. Dried apples are quoted at 5 1/2 to 6 1/2c per lb. and evaporated 10c to 15c.
