No Action Expected This Session, and Then the Fight Will Be Fought Over Again—Whether Cleveland Will Be a Member of the Cabinet—Business Expected to Pick Up—Bonded Warehouses Fully Cleared—Activity in Whisky Circles—Opinions of Politicians on the New Law.

Washington, Aug. 14.—Today there were numerous conferences on both sides of the Senate Chamber, all of which had as their object the recommitment of what steps shall be taken in regard to the four tariff bills sent over by the House. What the result will be is problematical. The Republican Finance Committee was in session for a time, and discussed the situation from every point of view. One of the prominent leaders of the Republicans expressed the belief that none of the bills would receive the affirmative action of the Senate, and said they would either be postponed or sent to the Finance Committee, where they would remain until the next session of Congress at least.

Prominent Democrats admit the impossibility of action, although there are many who insist that the vote shall be taken. Republicans will have the Louisiana Senators and the Populists on their side if they begin a fight against the tariff bills. The Democrats are confident that if the Democrats attempt to force that bill to the floor they will precipitate a debate of a quorum. Washington, Aug. 14.—Reports received at the Treasury Department from whisky-producing centres state there is a shortage of whisky in the market at the old rate of 90 cents a gallon, before the new tax of \$1.10 per gallon became operative. The average monthly consumption of whisky is between 8,000,000 and 9,000,000 gallons. Since the new tax was put into effect, the receipts from national revenue have largely increased. In the current year, one month and a half, the receipts have exceeded \$20,000,000 for the corresponding period last year. For this month they are \$1,500,000 ahead of the corresponding period last year. It is estimated the total receipts from internal revenue for this month will not exceed \$20,000,000.
