

It is, moreover, from this source that Enderby obtains the electric light which it uses.

There is no sewerage system in vogue other than that of septic tanks.

As elsewhere throughout the Okanagan Valley there is no land available for pre-emption within many miles, and since the prices of land vary considerably it would, perhaps, be unwise to hazard a definite statement. Therefore, reference to "Statistics" or to the local authorities is recommended.

The position of the city—lying as it does on a gradual incline—affords excellent advantages for the building of residences, all of which command a beautiful prospect of the surrounding country.

The cost of building material, of fuel, of living, and other necessities of life generally, is much the same at Enderby as throughout the Valley, but varies slightly according to prices ruling in the different markets. But we may here remark that every year there is a large increase in the number of good residential buildings; which seems, after all, the surest criterion to judge by in matters of this sort.
