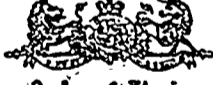

CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS

ONTARIO.

The determination of manufacturers of white pine lumber to hold prices firm has met with success. The lists sent out for the month of July show that prices of every grade are being kept up. While there is plenty of lumber for sale, there seems to be no pressure on the part of holders to dispose of their stocks, nor is there any reason why such should be the case if a conservative policy in respect to production is pursued. Very hopeful reports regarding the pine situation come from the Georgian Bay district. A large Michigan concern recently purchased 10,000,000 feet of white pine lumber at Sprague, 10,000,000 feet at Blind River, 20,000,000 feet at Midland, and 4,500,000 feet at John's Island, making a total of 44,500,000 feet. The bulk, and perhaps all, of this lumber will be taken to Saginaw and Bay City to stock the yards there which were formerly supplied by the Michigan mills which cut Canadian logs. The present indications are that there will be a scarcity of long lumber before many months. Retail trade in Toronto has improved within the past week. Shingles and lath continue strong, XXX white pine shingles selling at \$2.80 retail, and No. 1 lath about \$3. Enquiries for hardwoods have been more numerous, particularly from manufacturing concerns, which suggests that their stocks are getting low.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

A better feeling prevails among the spruce manufacturers of the eastern provinces on account of the improvement in spruce in the British market. While this improvement has as yet been confined to Quebec spruce, it is almost certain to extend to the production of the Maritime provinces. The depression in the British market has resulted in increased shipments from New Brunswick and Nova Scotia to France, Spain, Australia and South America, and it is probable that when the shipping season closes the quantity of stock remaining in the hands of Canadian manufacturers and shippers will not be abnormally large. There is no change in the prices of Quebec timber. New Brunswick cedar shingles are firmer, sales having been made at \$3 for extras on Boston rate of freight.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

About two hundred carpenters in Winnipeg have gone on strike, and it is feared that building work in that city will be seriously interfered with unless an early settlement is reached. Railway construction is being pushed on several lines in Manitoba and the Territories, particularly the Canadian Northern line through to Lake Superior. The farmers are now busy harvesting the abundant crop, and it is expected that there will be a brisk demand for lumber for new buildings and improvements. In British Columbia local trade is rather quiet, but large export shipments are being made. In the first six months of this year eight cargoes of timber were shipped to China, and large orders are on the books.

UNITED STATES

The most optimistic opinions continue to be expressed regarding the white pine market of the United States. The developments of the past week have, with one exception, been favorable to a further hardening of lumber prices. That exception was the publication of the Government crop report, showing an expected yield of corn slightly less than 1,300,000,000 bushels. This is greatly below the average. The demand for lumber from retailers has shown a slight falling off in the principal corn producing States, but the abundant wheat crop has largely offset the effects of the decreased production of corn. The factors of strength of the past week have been the advance in
