### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

Lumber is moving more briskly than last week. Dealers who have been running along for some time with light supplies are now stocking up to some extent, and invariably request that the lumber be shipped immediately. The need of the stock and the fear of an inadequate supply of cars for transportation are responsible for this urgency. The most activity is confined to the cities, where the requirement for building purposes is quite large. Common boards in pine are meeting with a ready sale, while hemlock in boards and dimension lumber is in steady request. The general hardwood trade is showing more life under the lead of oak and birch. The former is slightly firmer in price, as the supply is by no means large. Basswood still lags, the substitution of other woods last year owing to its abnormal scarcity having affected the demand this season. Interior finishing stock is active, as buildings have now advanced to the point where they are ready for this work.

There is an enlarged demand for pine lath and higher prices are predicted. It is believed that the supply will not last until the mills resume operations next spring, as there is not a large stock at the mills in Ontario and a decided shortage has developed in the Lake Superior district.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK

Spruce lumber prices are being maintained, but trade is still on the quiet side. There is a fairly active movement of stock in a retail way in Montreal, where building operations are being pushed with some vigor. In the country districts, however, there is not much doing and stocks at the mills are accumulating. The supply of inch lumber in both spruce and hemlock is large and prices of this size are easier. There has been a further decline in the price of square and waxy pine lumber, the best price obtainable at Quebec for 19 to 20-inch waxy being about 65 cents. Square birch is also a shade weaker.

UNITED STATES.

The lumber business in the United States is proceeding along very satisfactory lines. Business in July was better than in August, and September so far has shown a substantial improvement over last month. Evidence develops almost every day that stocks at the producing points are not large and are in strong hands, and there is little doubt as to the maintenance of prices. Wholesale dealers report an increased enquiry for white pine and a larger movement is looked for next month. Eastern retail dealers are finding that it is impossible to secure lumber by making an offer lower than the prices asked by the wholesalers, who in turn have been prevented from lowering their quotations owing to the firm attitude of the manufacturers. The box business is for the first time in many months showing signs of an unsettled condition, and consequently box lumber is not quite as firm as it was. Pennsylvania producers have advanced the base price of hemlock \$1 per thousand to \$16.50, but the basis at Buffalo continues at \$15.50. The advance in the price of yellow pine lumber has been helpful to hemlock. Spruce prices are being well maintained from the manufacturers' standpoint spruce has not looked so promising for some months as it does now, and as the mills will soon cease operating for the season, prices are not likely to be lower this year.

The demand for hardwood lumber is steadily expanding. Plan oak is said to be selling \$2 per thousand higher than it did one month ago, with some doubt as to the ability of the manufacturers to meet the requirement. All other kinds are steady with the exception of basswood, which is being offered occasionally at lower prices. The Wisconsin Hardwood Lumbermen's Association have adopted a new price list which shows that there is the strongest confidence in the future and that prices are expected to be considerably higher before January.
