

ONE of the most noted women in New York journalism is Miss Middy Morgan who does the cattle reports for some four New York papers, among them the *Time* and *Tribune*. She has acquired a fund of knowledge of cattle and horses, both on the farm and turf, which may be envied by the most experienced male sportsman. Her journalistic career dates from an interview with Horace Greeley, whose rather jocose allusion to the need of a reporter of cattle sales, was turned to earnest account.
