### ARTICLE 10 Arbitration

1. In case of disagreement between two or more members of the Union and interest of the Union an to the interpretation of the Convention and the Agreements, or as to the responsibility is a second of the convention and the Agreements. sibility imposed on an Administration by the application of these Acts, in question in dispute is decided by arbitration. To that end, each of the Admiristrations concerned chooses another member of the Union not directly interested in the matter.

If one of the Offices in disagreement does not take any action on a proposal for arbitration within a period of six months, or of nine months in the case distant countries, the International P distant countries, the International Bureau, on a request to that effect, may call on the defaulting Administration to appoint an arbitrator, or may appoint one officially one officially.

### ARTICLE 11

Withdrawal from the Union. Cessation of Participation in the Agreements
