UNION CONVENTION OF PARIS, MARCH 20th, 1883, FOR THE PROTECTION OF INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY, REVISED AT BRUSSELS, DECEMBER 14th, 1900, AT WASHINGTON, JUNE 2nd, 1911, AT THE HAGUE, NOVEMBER 6th, 1925 AND AT LONDON, JUNE 2nd, 1934.

French official text communicated by His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs in Great Britain.

The President of the German Reich; the President of the Austrian Republic: His Majesty the King of the Belgians; the President of the United States of Brazil; the President of the Republic of Cuba; His Majesty the King of Denmark; the President of the Republic of Spain; the President of the United States of America; the President of the Republic of Finland; the President of the French Republic; His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India; His Serene Highness the Regent of the Kingdom of Hungary; His Majesty the King of Italy; His Majesty the Emperor of Japan; His Serene Highness the Prince of Liechtenstein; His Majesty the Sultan of Morocco; the President of the United States of Mexico; His Majesty the King of Norway; Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands; the President of the Polish Republic, in the name of Poland and of the Free City of Danzig; the President of the Portuguese Republic; His Majesty the King of Sweden; the Federal Council of the Swiss Confederation; the President of the Czechoslovak Republic; His Highness the Bey of Tunis; the President of the Turkish Republic; His Majesty the King of Yugoslavia,

Having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in, and additions to, the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, and at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Here follows the names of the plenipotentiaries for Germany, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Cuba, Denmark, Spain, United States of America, Finland, France, Syria and Lebanon, Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Commonwealth of Australia, the Irish Free State, Hungary, Italy, Japan, Liechtenstein, Morocco, Mexico, Norway, Netherlands, Poland, the Free City of Dantzig, Portugal, Sweden, Switzerland, Czechoslovakia, Tunis, Turkey and Yugoslavia.

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:

ARTICLE 1

1. The countries to which the present Convention applies constitute themselves into a Union for the protection of industrial property.

2. The protection of industrial property is concerned with patents, utility models, industrial designs or models, trade marks, trade names and indications of source or appellations of origin, and the repression of unfair competition.
